# Department of Education launches Consultation on Early Years Education



The Department of Education has launched a public consultation on early years education as part of a major review of early years qualifications.

They are looking for submissions from childcare practitioners, students, parents, education and training providers, employers in the sector and anyone else with an interest in the area.

The review aims to find out what mix of knowledge and skills early childhood educators need to ensure quality education outcomes for all children.

There is a survey available online for childcare practitioners and employers to complete. There is also a template for submissions for anyone else who would like to contribute to the consultation.

Would you like to apply for a grant or financial assistance?

The **SUSI grant system** offers funding to students

in full time third level education. All types of students can get financial support from SUSI including people who have just finished school and mature students who would like to go back to study. The amount of funding you receive will depend on your household income.

The **online application system for SUSI grants** will open in mid-April for students that would like to start college or university in September 2015.

## The new Junior Cert



In September 2014 secondary schools began to start teaching the **new Junior Cert** to 1<sup>st</sup> Year students.

## Why did they change the Junior Cert?

A study by the ESRI found that a lot of students felt there was too much information to learn for the Junior Cert. There was also a problem with some students beginning to lose interest in school in second year. It was felt that because of exam pressure there wasn't a lot of time or space for students to learn other skills or information which would be beneficial.

#### What will the new Junior Cert be like?

The new Junior Cert will be made up of **subjects** and **short courses**. Short courses are new and designed to give students the chance to explore new areas of learning and develop new skills. There will also be a new emphasis on developing **6 key skills** which have been identified as important for kids to have in the 21<sup>st</sup> century.

#### Will it all change at once?

No. The new Junior Cert is going to be introduced a little bit at a time for the next few years. In September 2014 they started to teach the new English curriculum and in September 2015 they will start teaching the new Science curriculum.
