Information for applicants

Age & Opportunity values and supports older artists in Ireland and is working with Pavee Point Traveller and Roma Centre to make an award to an older artist with a Traveller heritage.

Award for an Artist with a Traveller Heritage

We wish to recognise everyday creativity within the Traveller community and to support older artists/makers with a Traveller heritage. The award recognises how contemporary Traveller culture can be undervalued within mainstream society.

It is only recently that the term “artist” has become known and used in the Traveller community. This award is for creative people who might not call themselves artists but who carry out creative activities such as woodwork, writing, poetry, storytelling, dance, film and video, photography, sculpture, drawing, painting fabric and needle craft, metal work and theatre, drama and music and singing. You may be inspired by Traveller traditions for example wagon-making, tinsmithing, beady pockets or you may work in a modern day context only.

The award is specifically intended to highlight and support creativity in Traveller communities and increase visibility for people who are not given a chance to showcase their work or to be celebrated by wider Irish society.

The award is intended to be spent by artists and makers to further develop their work by funding training, networking, transport and materials.

Notes on terms

*For the purposes of this award, an older Traveller artist is defined as someone over 40 years, ([as per a Department of Health report 2019](#)) and who is recognised in their community as contributing to Traveller creative culture.

One award of €500 will be made to the successful applicant.

As above, the award is intended to be spent on artists/makers further developing their work including buying materials and any activity that supports their creativity.

Please note that Age & Opportunity also offers bursaries/awards for emerging artists and professional development which are open for everyone to apply to.

Call for Applications

Application Process:

There are two ways to apply for this award:

1. **Make a short video or audio recording** of yourself answering the questions on the application form. This can be sent to us by WhatsApp or email. Please also send some samples of work (2-3 photos or videos or audio files), which can also be sent by WhatsApp or email.

Q1 – Tell us a bit about yourself: (1 min approx. speaking time)

How to qualify:

The Age & Opportunity Award for an Artist from a Traveller Heritage will be offered to one artist, (working in any artform) aged 40 + who:

- Self-identifies as Irish Traveller or of a Traveller heritage;
- Has a regular creative or artistic practice (as shown in the application and with, examples of work);
- Is working in any artform and based in the Republic of Ireland.

Selection Criteria:

Please note, applications will be assessed by an appointed panel which will include Traveller artists/makers. Selection for the award will be according to the following criteria:

- Strength of past achievements as an artist and future plans for your creative work. (reference from Traveller community);
- Artistic quality and ambition as shown through your **supporting material (photos, videos etc);**
- Examples of how this award will help your work as an artist/maker as shown by the application form answers;
